Assessments & Measures

***Ages & Stages Questionnaire – S.E.**

A companion assessment to the full ASQ (see above) focused solely on the social and emotional development in young children used to identify children in need of further assessment or intervention.

***Ages & Stages Questionnaire 3**

The ASQ tracks developmental progress and is a screening tool covering areas of fine motor, gross motor, speech & language, cognitive and social-emotional. For children ages 2 months to 5 years, the ASQ is a widely used measure and leader in its industry.

AML-R: Behavior Rating Scale

A 12-item, teacher-competed, quick-screening tool that aids in identifying children experiencing school adjustment problems across three scales: aggressive behavior, shy/anxious behavior and learning difficulties ranging from “never” to “most or all of the time”. This scale can help to identify a particular problem area and assist mental health professionals in determining an approach that will best meet a child's specific needs.

Child-Parent Relationship Scale

The CPRS is a self-report completed by a parent to assess their perceptions of the relationship he/she has with their child. It is appropriate for use with parents of children ages 3-12. Author: Robert C. Pianta

CRAFFT

A screening tool designed for use with youth under the age of 21. It screens for high risk behaviors related to drug and alcohol use. Developed by: John R Knight, MD and colleagues at CeASAR at Boston Children's Hospital

DESSA: Full and Mini

The full DESSA includes 72-items. It's a normalized, behavior rating scale that assesses social-emotional competencies and protective factors for children in grades K – 8. COMET has the full form and four mini forms.

Edinburgh Postnatal Depression Scale

A 10-question, self-report that identifies mothers at risk for “perinatal” depression. This scale can also be used to screen for general depression in other groups.

***Family Involvement Questionnaire**

A parent or primary caregiver report that assesses family involvement for children in Pre-K up to first grade. The FIQ includes questions about various types of parent activity across home, classroom and school contexts.

Lie/Bet

Used to screen for pathological gambling behavior, this survey has also been used by organizations to identify people at risk for other pathological behaviors or suicidal tendencies. Authors: E.E. Johnson, R. Hammer, R.M. Nora, B. Tan, N. Eistenstein and C. Englehart

Parent Appraisal of Children's Experiences

The PACE is a parent-completed measure used to collect information about the life experiences a child has had including health information, family situation and school readiness. It is typically used for students entering kindergarten and provides schools and communities with the information they need to understand their incoming kindergarten students.

Pathways Survey Tools

Part of the Pathways Certification process, these tools help childcare centers assess their readiness before they begin the accreditation process.

Primary Project: BIF, PSR, Child Log

A collection of instruments used to support Primary Project. They collect background data for children enrolled in the program and other program support data.

Protective Factors Survey

The PFS is designed for use with parents and caregivers participating in family support and child maltreatment prevention services. It assesses multiple protective factors to prevent child abuse and neglect. Owned: FRIENDS National Center for Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention

Rating Scales: ACRS, TCRS, PCRS, SRS, YRS, CRS

Instruments in this series assess the social-emotional health of children across four domains: task orientation, peer social skills, anxious/withdrawn, behavior control. The instrument can be completed by different parties: parent, teacher, child associate or by the child/youth him/herself.

Stage of Change Scales

Administrator, Self, Mentor/Coach and Educator, Family – a simple rating form that consists of 6 to 7 items assessing an individual's readiness to change their child care practices or other personal goals.

The Survey of Well-being of Young Children

The SWYC is a comprehensive screening instrument for children under 5 years of age. The SWYC includes sections on developmental milestones, behavioral/emotional development, and family risk factors.

Youth Risk Behavior Survey

Developed by the CDC, the YRBS asks about various types of risky behaviors for youth and adults including: violence, risky sexual behaviors, HIV infection, alcohol and other drug use, tobacco use, unhealthy diet and inadequate physical activity. Developed by: U.S. CDC

Answer Sheet Only

Similar to recording data in a neutral spreadsheet, COMET can provide convenient data storage for responses in an answer sheet format. These support keeping responses and scores from external, third-party providers appropriately linked to the children.
